The Cart Before the Horse?

If the Bible is what it claims to be, and it is (I Timothy 3:16-17); if we are to preach it, and it alone, and we are (II Timothy 4:1-2); if we are to preach all of it – the whole counsel of God as Paul did and as Christ said (Acts 20:27, Matthew 28:20); if the Old Testament prepared the way for the New Testament, and it did (Hebrews 10:1, Romans 15:4, II Corinthians 10:11); if, "The New is in the Old contained



and the Old is by the New explained" and it is; if the better we know the Old Testament the better we will understand the New Testament, and this is so; if the New Testament writers quoted from, or referred to it hundreds of times, and they did; then surely preachers in training need to adequately, and exceptionally learn the Old Testament before they can really understand and appreciate the New Testament. Otherwise they are "getting the cart before the horse."

At the Norris Bible Baptist

Seminary, the students are taken through a Bible survey of the Old and New Testaments in order and study the first five books of the Bible their first year. The second year they are taken through the Historical, Poetical and Prophetical Books. It is not until their last two years they work their way through the New Testament books. If a man starts to study the Bible seriously in preparation for the ministry, and he jumps into the New before really knowing the Old, he gets ahead of himself, and does not have the sufficient knowledge needed to pull (or push!?!) into his study. Hence the small cart in the above portrayal is fitting. In other words, we are teaching the whole English Bible – beginning with Moses (i.e., Luke 24:27, 44), and staying with it until we finish with the Book of Revelation the last semester of the student's schooling.

The Old Testament FORESHADOWED the New Testament (Hebrews 10:1).

The Old Testament FORESAW the New Testament (Galatians 3:8).

The Old Testament FORETOLD the New Testament (Jeremiah 31:31).

We teach the whole Bible – the English Bible; and we do it in logical sequence.
